## **In-Text Citation Examples**

The in-text citation examples below detail [American Psychological Association \(APA\)](#), [Modern Language Association \(MLA\)](#) and [Chicago Manual of Style](#) format for single author and multiple-author citations.

### **APA Single Author Example**

### **APA Multiple-Author Example**
